He was never without his tools and was in constant demand by all members of the family as well as neighbors and acquaintances. He loved the challenge of fixing things and was very adept at it. It defined his essence.

He had his pilots license at one point in his life, enjoying taking the family on short excursions. Later on, he and Evelyn enjoyed RVing, taking the grandkids on many of those excursions, fishing, and metal detecting.

Curtis was pre-deceased by his wife Evelyn and is survived by his children John Johnson, Glynne Steele, Wayne Johnson, Terri Stokes. He had 8 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.
