John William Rodgers, loving husband, father, and brother, met his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, face to face on September 12, 2017, after a long battle with pancreatic cancer. He passed away at his home in Missouri City, Texas, surrounded by his loving family, and is now completely healed and rejoicing in heaven.

He was born on June 14, 1950 in Sarasota, Florida to William Matheny Rodgers and Dorothy Halle Sinks. John grew up in Houston, Texas and graduated from Sharpstown High School in 1969 and later from the University of Houston, receiving a B.S. in Electrical Engineering Technology. He worked for W.K.M. for 16 years, and later briefly for Regal Machine Tools. He then opened his own business, AIM Industrial Maintenance, Inc. which he operated for 23 years. John ended his working career at Ellwood Machining and Welding. He loved repairing machinery and took great pride in being able to "resurrect" an old piece of industrial equipment and get it running again.

John was a genuine person, kind-hearted and encouraging to everyone he met. He never met a stranger. He also had a great sense of humor and loved to make people laugh.

Spending time with his family, barbecuing, playing games at home and watching old westerns were his favorite ways to spend his time. He was also an avid reader.

John loved the Lord and loved studying His Word, and was a faithful member and deacon of Heritage Baptist Church. He loved his church family, loved

singing in the choir and teaching Sunday School.

He learned to fish from his father and it was something that he enjoyed throughout his life. He loved the outdoors and spending time at his wife's family farm. He also enjoyed bird watching, collecting stamps and watching the Astros.

John met the love of his life, Linda Sue Thompson, in Physics class at the University of Houston. They married in 1984 in Missouri City, Texas and were happily married for 33 years.

He is survived by his spouse Linda, of Missouri City, Texas, daughters Laura Anne Gagliano of Missouri City, Texas and Sarah Lynn Easterling of Rosenberg, Texas, and their spouses, Cory Gagliano and Matt Easterling; sisters Virginia Sicola of Amarillo, Texas and Patricia Nixon of Huntsville, Texas and their spouses, Tony Sicola and Aaron Nixon; nephews Alex Sicola, William Nixon and Tom Nixon, and niece Lisa Nixon Baker, and numerous great nieces and nephews.
