Karon (Kay) Elizabeth Pritchard Moore O'Brien was born in Waco, Texas on May 1, 1946. Her wonderful parents were Edker and Frankie May Huff Pritchard. After her father died, her mother married Robert (Bill) Millsaps who became another wonderful dad.

Kay graduated from Reagon High School in Houston, Texas and Mary Hardin-Baylor College in Belton in 1968 with a B.S. degree in Elementary Education. She taught in the Willow Run School District in Ypsilanti, Michigan, the Lorena Independent School District, and the Lewisville Independent School District for a total of 29 years.

She married Ronald Bradley Moore on August 17, 1968, and had two adorable children, Julie Ann Moore on July 19, 1972, and Jeremy Allen Moore on September 18, 1975. Her precious grandchildren are Jacob Matthew Moore and Hannah Olivia Harlow. Kay has a surviving brother and his wife, Eddie Wayne and Vicki Jo Pritchard.

Kay's son Jeremy Allen Moore died of a heart condition in 2022. She also had a younger sister, Jean Montgomery, who died 10 years ago. Other survivors include Kay's brother-in-law Donald Neil Montgomery and his son Dusty Neil Montgomery, Kay's nephew. There are many other loving cousins and nieces and nephews who survive Kay.

Until her own children started school, Kay worked in the Preschool Department of the First Baptist Church of Woodway in Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, the Women's Bible Study, and the Mothers' Day Out

Program.

After Kay retired from teaching school, she became a Dallas County Master Gardener in 2011. She worked as the coordinator of Plant Sharing for the new classes of Master Gardeners, in the school garden of Anne Frank Elementary School, and in the Farmers Branch Rose Gardens.

On March 4, 2000, Kay married Robert (Bob) Joseph O'Brien who survives her. What a wonderful time she and Bob had together! This happy union had the added benefit of adding many loving sisters-in-law, stepsons and stepdaughters, and grandchildren to Kay's family.

Kay played tennis for exercise and fun in her spare time. Her tennis buddies in Waco and in Dallas became many of her closest friends as well as her classmates at Mary Hardin-Baylor. From childhood neighborhoods, churches (especially Tabernacle Baptist), schools, and parks in Houston came other special friends.

Another hobby with Bob was growing roses in their garden. Happy times were also spent attending meetings at the Antique Rose Emporium during the Festival of Rose weekend and visiting with their gardening friends.
