I had a blind date with, fell in love with and married the love of my life, Miriam, August 15, 1965. I finished my four year enlistment in Newport, Rhode Island. Miriam and I then moved to Houston, Texas to start our lives. I went to University of Houston for the final two years. In 1968, we purchased our first home in Houston. Then came the next two loves of my life, our daughters, Julie Michelle and Karen Leslie. God blessed us with our family. I enjoyed the growing up years of the girls. In 1981, my mother gave us a motor home, and
