I still haven't been able to come to terms with your sudden passing. Ever since I received the news three weeks ago, everything has felt somehow unreal, as if I'm still not fully in this reality. Being in Japan while you were in America, I couldn't come see you, nor could I hear your voice one last time—and that is something that continues to weigh heavily on my heart.

Ever since you were little, our relatives would always say how much we resembled each other. Each time, I felt a little shy, but also deeply happy, and I sensed a special connection between us. Perhaps I didn't think of you only as my dear niece, but also, in some way, as a part of myself.

The time we spent together around your twenties—going out for meals, attending concerts—those memories have now become precious treasures to me. Back then, you were as kind and thoughtful as ever, but more than that, you had a strong sense of who you were. You carried your own beliefs and expressed them gently, yet with quiet strength. When I realized that, I remember thinking from the bottom of my heart, “How wonderful you are.” I feel that, even as someone older, I learned so much from you.

*Mana-chan, we'll meet again someday, won't we?
I need to believe that—because right now, it still feels a little too painful not to.*

That photo you gave me, smiling as you said, “Keep this—it'll bring you good luck.” The one taken in America, with your bright, happy smile. I still keep it close to me. Every time I look at it, your voice and presence come back to me, and my heart feels just a little warmer.

There are so many things I wish I could have said, so much more I wanted to share. But for now, please let me simply say thank you.

*Mana-chan, I am truly grateful that I got to meet you.
I will always love you.*

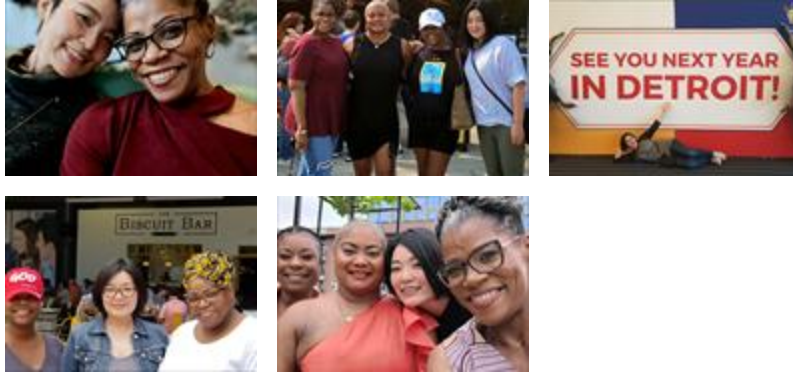
