Raising her family gave her so much joy. She often referred to the times of raising her small children as "the best time of my life." She was completely devoted to her family. She showed up, always. To every game, every performance, every celebration, even if it meant driving several hours to get there. Sharon was a proud and deeply involved mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother. She loved her children and grandchildren massively and they felt it every single day. She would say, "a good mom makes every child feel like they're her favorite," and her favorite was a title everyone fought for.

Sharon had a special charm for making occasions and celebrations unforgettable. She really knew how to throw a party! Birthdays, baby showers, family gatherings- she knew how to pour love into it, making it memorable and lively- often with live music!

She worked at SMU Law School for 35 years, where she formed friendships with many, including her best friend, Debbie Seiter. Her retirement party was a reflection of the joy she brought to others, filled with laughter and stories shared by colleagues who adored her.

She was proud of her Native American and Irish roots. She loved celebrating her heritage by attending the annual Native American Pow Wow and the North Texas Irish Festival every year. She loved travelling, her favorite place being Ireland, where she got to visit multiple times. She loved a homey pub and singing along to traditional Irish music.

She modeled what it meant to be a loving daughter by taking her mother breakfast every morning, spending Saturdays caring and running errands with her, and even after becoming sick- still making sure someone else in the family would tend to her. Her mother was always on her mind and they were so blessed to spend Sharon's last months together at CC Young and The Villages in Lake Highlands.

Those who knew Sharon will remember her for her warmth, her stories, her deep rooted faith in Jesus, and her commitment to ensuring that everyone she encountered was fed and felt loved.

Her legacy is one of steadfast love, celebration, faith and family. Forever treasured, deeply missed, lovingly remembered. We were all blessed and highly favored just to know her.
