Thomas J Weisenbach, Sr, "Pops" 91, passed away peacefully on December 31, 2024, at his home at Hidden Springs of McKinney in McKinney, Texas. He was born on June 11, 1933, in Buffalo, New York to Rudolph G. and Irene M. (Smith) Weisenbach.

Tom grew up in Erie, Pennsylvania. He graduated from Academy High School in Erie in 1951. Tom excelled in both basketball and baseball while at Academy, earning "All City" honors in both sports. Pops was a proud United States Navy veteran having served in Chincoteague, Virginia and aboard ship based in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. After serving in the United States Navy, Tom graduated from Gannon College in Erie with a bachelor's degree in business administration. Tom worked for both Erie Insurance Exchange and the State Farm Insurance Company during his long career in the insurance industry, retiring from State Farm as a Claim Superintendent in January of 1996.
